Please be aware that some of the major mapping services and vehicle GPS systems do not yet recognize our address. Encanterra is located on the southeast corner of Combs & Gantzel Roads in San Tan Valley, Arizona. The easiest route from most areas of the Valley is Interstate 60 East and then South on Ironwood Road. Another option is from the San Tan Loop 202. Exit south on Power Road, turn east on Ocotillo Road, then south on Gantzel Road. The Club is located just east of the intersection of Combs and Gantzel roads (Ironwood turns into Gantzel at Ocotillo Road), and the entrance is marked by prominent wooden gates and the US, Arizona, and Canadian flags.

Attire Policy

Proper golf attire is required for all players, and is defined as the following:

Men: Shirts must be tucked and have collars (soft, hard or mock) and sleeves; camp (Tommy Bahama) shirts may be worn untucked if properly pressed. Slacks or Bermuda shorts of mid-thigh length, cargo shorts that are pressed, all pockets flat and no strings hanging are considered appropriate attire. Tank tops, tee shirts, mesh shirts, sweat pants, warm-up suits, blue jeans, denim of any color, non-pressed cargo shorts, swim wear, short shorts, cutoffs, gym shorts, tennis outfits or other athletic gear is not permitted.

Women: Dresses, skirts, slacks, mid-length shorts and blouses are considered appropriate attire. Halter tops, tee shirts, cut-offs, sweat pants, warm-up suits, blue jeans, denim of any color, swim wear, tennis dresses, short shorts or other athletic shorts are not permitted.

Golf Shoes: Appropriate golf shoes are required for all golfers. Shoes with metal spikes and football, soccer or other large, knobby spike shoes are prohibited on Club grounds. Shoes with "soft spikes" or spikeless shoes may be worn. Tennis shoes or other soft sole shoes are subject to the approval of the golf professional on duty.
